

## CityView Church Protocols for Exposure to COVID-19

### I. Preface:

This document is to be used as a guide to follow when a staff member, volunteer, church member, or church attender has had indirect or direct exposure to COVID-19.

- Indirect contact can be defined as, “coming into contact with a person for longer than 15 minutes and within 6 feet of a person who is one person removed from direct contact with someone who is confirmed to have COVID-19.”
- Direct contact can be defined as, “coming into contact with a person for longer than 15 minutes and within 6 feet of someone who is confirmed to have COVID-19.” The CDC also indicates close contact can occur 48 hours prior to the individual testing positive or the onset of symptoms.

### II. Individual Indirect Contact:

For staff or volunteers who have had indirect contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19:

- No test or quarantine required. The person may choose to self-quarantine during this period and continue to work from home.
- Regularly monitor for a fever and other symptoms for a 14 day period.
- Wear a mask to work.
- If a fever or other symptoms develop within 14 day period, then contact physician for testing and isolate yourself until results are determined.

### III. Return to CityView after Positive COVID

For persons who have tested positive for COVID-19 with symptoms, they may return to our facilities in alignment with the CDC recommendations. As of 11/13:

- Individuals who experienced COVID-19 symptoms may return when:
  - At least 10 days since symptoms first appeared AND
  - At least 24 hours with no fever without fever reducing medication AND
  - Other symptoms of COVID-19 are improving
  - Individuals with a weakened immune system should consult their physician to determine if longer isolation is recommended.
- Individuals who tested positive, but have not experienced symptoms may return when
  - 10 days have passed since the date of the positive test

### III. Individual Direct Contact:

For staff or volunteers who have had direct contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19:

- Consistent with CDC guidelines, individuals who come in close contact with someone who has tested positive are asked to stay home for 14 days from last contact with individual positive for COVID-19.
- Individuals should regularly monitor for a fever and other symptoms.
- Volunteers who come into direct contact with someone may return to volunteering after a two-week break if they have no symptoms or have tested negative for COVID-19.
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### IV. Procedure for Events:

If we are notified that someone who has attended an CVC event and then receives a positive test result for COVID-19, the following actions should be taken:

Individual was symptomatic while attending event and later notifies CityView of COVID-19 positive test result.	<p>To the best of their ability, CityView will work with the individual to identify individuals with direct contact (within 6 feet for more than 15 minutes) with the individual and notify them via email or phone and ask them to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Follow CDC guidelines for exposure</li> <li>• Avoid attending in person CityView events for 14 days from time of exposure</li> <li>• Monitor symptoms and contact their physician if any symptoms appear</li> </ul> <p>In addition, CityView will provide the following to staff in close direct contact:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Reimbursement for COVID testing. Staff should use CDC and medical advice for timing of test after potential exposure, which may be 3-5 days after potential exposure.</li> <li>• Determine if staff member can work from home during 14-day quarantine.</li> </ul>	<p>Notify those who attended the event by email and with as much information as possible while keeping names confidential and</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Notify them of steps taken to clean and disinfect the area in which the person was located</li> <li>• Ask all members to monitor symptoms.</li> </ul> <p>If large numbers in attendance, may also post Facebook message in private Facebook group</p>	
Individual was asymptomatic while attending event AND Individual began experiencing symptoms within 48 hours of the event AND Individual tests positive for COVID-19			<p>If significant number of individuals were in direct contact and/or a large number of staff with direct contact are identified, a portion of in person activities or the entire in person event may be cancelled or moved to a virtual format. If this occurs:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Information should be included in communication to church members and attendees.</li> <li>• A facebook post will notify others about changes in the event</li> </ul>
Individual was asymptomatic while attending event AND Individual tests positive for COVID-19 within 48 hours of event			
Individual was asymptomatic while attending event AND Begins experiencing symptoms more than 48 hours after event AND Tests positive for COVID 19 within 4 days of attending the event	<p>Due to CDC definitions and guidelines, it is unlikely direct contact occurred during the event.</p>	<p>Notify the entire church by email and with as much information as possible while keeping names confidential and ask all members to monitor symptoms. Let the church know that direct contact was not suspected, but that the church is being notified out of an abundance of caution.</p>	

Individual was asymptomatic while attending event AND Tests positive for COVID 19 between than 48 hours and 4 days after event AND Remains asymptomatic		

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
